The M.G. Car Club Y Type Register is celebrating the 65th Anniversary of the launch of the model with a number of events throughout 2012. The first of these will be held in ABINGDON MARKET PLACE on SUNDAY 25th MARCH 2012 from 2.00 p.m.

Abingdon is of course the birth place of M.G.'s produced between 1930 and the closure of the plant in 1980. It is therefore fitting that the town is the centre of the 65th Anniversary of the Y Type marque. Y's were produced in three models – the Y from 1947-51, the YT (a tourer) between 1948 & 1950 and the YB from 1952-53. During this period a total of 8336 were constructed.

The Y was a stylish saloon fitted with IFS, rack and pinion steering and many other features (notable of which was the independent hydraulic jacking system) including sliding roof, leather upholstery and winding front window screen. Although difficult to confirm accurately, it is currently believed that around 1,085 cars have survived worldwide. This is the current list of 'live' cars on our records but for obvious reasons may not be totally accurate. Cars may have been broken etc. since we began listing them back in 1991.
