# Dave Smith's Day in the Garage

## A Day In The Garage or "Fire In The Hole"

Dave Smith's "Day In The Garage" was held May 17th this year and turned out to be a very productive afternoon for the dedicated band of Rowdies who drove out either to work on their cars or to sit around drinking beer and eating hot dogs while watching others work on theirs. Our own Dave Quinn came along as an unofficial photographer since once you own a "trailer-queen" I'm sure that you either have no work left to be done, or you simply sign a check to be sure it gets done. Oh well, I suppose any of us could simply become jaded as well, and at least Dave can still remember the old days when he actually drove an MGA.

For the other Rowdies there who are still forced to drive their cars to meets, there was work to be done. Ken Nelson (ye humble author of this story) brought along a new vinyl top to install on his car after removing the original 30+ year old top that it came with in 1978.

After shedding a slight tear in remembrance of its faithful service all those years, he had removed it the evening before to be sure the wooden header piece was still serviceable. Neil Griffin and Rich Pollion helped out to make the measuring and stretching of a new top go much quicker. Ken stopped at Lowe's on the way and purchased an electric staple gun that also made the job easier.

Neil proved to be a veritable wizard when it came to

making a first class tight front corner looking as good as any I've seen elsewhere. He must have been good at making up his bunk with crisp military corners in the past also.

Placing the "Lift-A-Dot" fasteners was easier than I expected since no dedicated punch was available. Using a circular punch for the center and a sharp knife for the four prongs worked almost as well, and the job was accomplished without a hitch.

Unfortunately, I couldn't say the same for the work on Dick Grucz's car. He drove in planning to replace the distributor and carburetors with rebuilt units he had at home. That was done, but nary a sputter was available from the engine after the job was finished. Gordie Bird, Dave Smith, and Dick spent much of the afternoon rechecking and replacing parts until, after finally resetting valve lash, carb float bowl settings, and distributor timing, they were rewarded with the smooth firing of a 1500 cc engine.



Just prior to finishing Dick's car, however, we were all treated to the pyrotechnics of our former Michigan Fire Marshall, Dave Smith, who proved that carb cleaner is indeed inflammable in spite of whatever you may have been told in school.

But that was nothing compared to the treat that Gordie provided for everybody. It seems that all his fiddling with the distributor and points trying to start the car resulted in quite a bit of fuel being pumped into the four cylinders and not being used to much effect. Gordie changed all that when he pulled the plugs out and decided to see if the coil was making a nice big fat spark like it should. So, with four pots full of gasoline vapor and a nice opening for a spark to travel through, he placed the coil wire alongside one of those holes to serve as a ground to test the spark. Well, I've got to tell you all that when that spark did hit, it had about the same effect as hitting the touch-hole on one of the 22-pounders that Captain Bligh must have carried on the Bounty.

Unfortunately, Dave Quinn hadn't had his camera ready for the big money shot, but I believe it must have been heard for a mile around. If the bonnet would have been down on the car, I'm sure it would have been airborne, but then again Gordie wouldn't have lost all the hair on one arm when it went "whoosh".

So there's always a trade-off for everything. I believe we all learned a big lesson about the explosive powers of gasoline in a confined space that afternoon. I know I did.

But as with all good and true Rowdie stories, this one had a happy ending. Dick drove home with a smooth running car, Ken had a nice new convertible top with a clear rear window and no holes, and Neil managed to


# Rowdies Birthday Bash & Auction
