### Tire Date Code

It is easy for us guys in the Old Car hobby to stretch out tires since they get such limited use. The tires on my MGA, which I had meant to check for aging as I had a paper somewhere explaining how, are now 11 years old!! All were brand new with only 100 miles on them when I bought the car but they were already 8 years old due to a lengthy restoration and storage.... and I added 3 more to that.

I checked my other MG tires from other cars and found one was 16 years old (thankfully I never drove it, just used it as a garage spare). The tires on my red MGA were just 2 years old when it was in the accident but now even those tires are 6 years old. Where does the time go.

Be sure to check each tire. On my truck I found one 5 years and one 7 years; the other two were new this year and their dates confirm they were only 2 months old when bought.

I'm disappointed to learn the RE01R's I bought from the Tire Rack for the S2000 were 1-1/2 years old when I bought them last October.

Here's a link to ABC's story of tire aging and how to read the code. They say the limit is 6 years and go into a full explanation on how to check.

Here's how the code works: The code is the last group of numbers in the long string normally found on the inside of tire. Examples are 414 means 41<sup>st</sup> week of 1994, 4202 means 42<sup>nd</sup> week of 2002, and 231 means 23<sup>rd</sup> week of 1991. Again, they say **6 years is the recommended limit**. Some of you will no doubt say that's bull but I'd hate to see any of us end up in that guy's garage in TX. Remember no matter how good they look, they are susceptible to dry rot and "tread separation". Probably good to spread the word.

#### Remanufactured Brake Pad Alert!

In the Jul/Aug MGA! magazine Mike Ash put out an alert there are rumors a vendor is selling remake brake parts that do not fit properly. Reliable sources have verified this. The story we are hearing is the unnamed vendor was alerted about the bad fit months ago when a Boston area repair garage first questioned the pads. Reportedly, brake parts manufactured under the COUNTRY brand may be slightly undersized. You should insure that the brake pads you are installing are the correct size. I would not want to be the first to find out, should they fail due to their size. Improper disc pads make a clunking noise when the brakes are applied because the H clip does not hold the pads firmly. Scarborough Faire (Cecelia) has the proper brake parts available.

#### Also:

Moss lists the early MGB coil springs as a replacement for the MGA coil springs. MGA coils are listed as "not available." One of the Rowdies tried installing these and discovered the replacement springs sent to him by Moss were 10-1/2". The proper spring size should be 9-1/4". The difference in spring size added 10+ percent to the ride height. I do not recommend changing the ride height. We have confirmed that Scarborough Faire has the proper springs for MGAs.

Thanks go to Cecilia for her continual quality control in a time when more and more remake parts seem to be questionable.
