

DAVE QUINN'S REPORT FROM MAD DOG'S AT THE GILMORE-JULY 2009

It seems each year I attend the Mad Dogs meet I find a car that captures my interest. This is the one for this year. At first glance it looks like a Rolls-Royce in appearance and it's 139" wheelbase. It's a 1937 Railton BWW600.

Upon closer inspection it has some really cool features. The first thing that caught my eye were the three cool luggage cases in the back. They match the color of the car and they slide in and out on the tray underneath that folds up, and then is covered up when the trunk is closed.

Above the luggage is the tool bin with tools, naturally, in matching car color. A glance in the front shows a glass map table that slides out and is illuminated. The tray in the rear seat is very interesting. It holds both a Cognac and Brandy bottle plus four glasses. Silver plated items included a corkscrew, match box holder, cigarette box, sandwich box, chocolate box..... and an aspirin bottle! The car also carries a fire extinguisher and first aid kit.

Finally it had two sliding sunshine roofs over the front and back; reportedly a totally new feature for any manufacturer.

This was a one-off car for Reginald Rippon, owner of Rippon Bros. Coach Builders. It was what we might call a 'concept car' today as it was intended to show the various options a customer could order. It had a straight 8-cylinder engine and was built on a Hudson long wheelbase. It's my understanding every Railton was powered by the Hudson built L-head Terraplane straight-8.

The car is part of Hostetler's Hudson collection in Suipshewanna, IN.





The meet was over at three PM with the awards (popular vote by owners) handed out. Mark & Cindy Michalak won Honorable Mention. They were the only winning MGA.















Carol and I just watched a nifty movie based around a MGB and I thought that I would write a review about it for the club.

"Sherman's Way" is a great way to spend an evening. "Sherman's Way" is another rich-kid-comes-of-agewith-the-help-of-a-washed-up-sport-has-been movie. Sherman (Michael Shulman, at his snooty best) is a very rich, spoiled college grad who is a "third generation unlicensed New Yorker who never learned how to drive". Sherman and the MGB are both a work in process. Sherman has a very hard time being spontaneous and the MGB needs a lot of love and attention as well. Sherman's first attempt at spontaneity drops him right into the passenger seat of the MG with The Bomber (well acted by James Le Gros). Sherman learns to drive a car and grow up while he and all his new friends restore a 1975 rubber Bumper MGB. I may sound a little cynical but in reality this is a pretty good flick. The Bomber has a spiffy side kick (Sparky the cat) that helps to flesh out the movie. The real attraction of course is the '75. There are tons of carzy scenes and watching the car morph from a 1975 rubber bumper pile of yuck into a chrome bumper show car in the space of a week is a true wonder to behold. Another thing that I liked is the fact that the MG engine noise is not some Ford muscle car overdub, it is real MG engine noise. I gave

It has an upbeat. ending, great pics of the MGB on winding California roads, and enough views of the restoration process to realistically portray a rebuild of the car (especially since in. California the bodywork consists of nothing more than pulling out a few dents, filling some scratches, and repainting). Sitting in a Michigan winter made me envious of the California climate as I watched them do all the car work out of doors, with Sherman. sleeping comfortably outside on a couch under a car-port. The protagonist (Palmer the "Bomber" who is a washed up near Olympic ski champion) is played admirably by James Le Gros and shows the trade offs encountered between the life of a free-spirit. able to capture and enjoy the moment, and Sherman who rigidly plans each step years in advance and whose life so far has never involved having to sleep outside on a worn. couch. Check this flick out; you won't regret. it.

MGA Muscle Cars!

Three MGA's were entered in a NASCAR sanctioned race at Bowman Gray Stadium in Winston-Salem in August of 1962. The track is a flat, quarter-mile oval. The race was the NASCAR Winston Cup "International 200" and had a 24 car starting field. 3 MGs, 1 Austin Healy, 3 AH Sprites, 1 Alfa, and 16 of Detroit's finest.

This is Bob Samyn's MGA racer which was dragraced by him back in the 1960's with a Chevy Corvette 327 engine. It ran the quarter mile in 10.68 sec at 127+ mph. This car has been to some Rowdy and NAMGAR meets in the past.

Bob English's MGA (with Chevy V8 engine)
Another type of racing that can be informative is the Drags. With just 1320 feet to get their work done, these cars have to be well thought out.
Whichever sanctioning body the particular strip works with (NHRA, AHRA, or IHRA), all the cars must conform to rules which are put in place for safety first and foremost. You can feel confident using these ideas. Some won't be applicable for a British V8 car, but some are worth your consideration. For example, many classes are required to have a battery disconnect on the outside of the car so the starter (the man who controls the tree) can reach over and kill the electrical power in case of trouble. You may not

want it accessible to the public, but a switch like this can save a car when there's an electrical problem. Many of these cars have the battery hidden in the trunk so pulling the cable would be difficult.
