



The video is a painful reminder of my 2004 crash

in my MGA of 32 years. My copilot, Mac McDonnell, and I thankfully survived a 45 mph crash in NY but not without some broken bones. This film is a good reminder for recommending 3point lap belts. At the time of our accident (a



young kid was ticketed for speeding out in front of us) I had lap belts. Without those, we probably would not be here. We both believe that our injuries would have been avoidable or minimal with a 3-point system, as the jack knife effect of our upper bodies suffered the damage. Clarke Spares sells a kit for anyone considering this. Both Mac and I have 3-points in our current cars, and I know a few other Rowdies do as well. Something to think about. {I will get off my soap box now}. Dave Quinn



CHAIRMAN'S CHATTER

Our club Treasurer is enjoying the Florida sunshine until mid-May 2012. That's why you will see him listed as Jeff Zorn, Treasurer Michigan Rowdies, 403 Bayou Village Drive, Tarpon Springs, FL 34689 on your dues renewal notices.

A member recently reminded me not everyone knows how easy it is to download a current membership list. I am reminded of that whenever MGA's travel together and I hear someone say, "Give me your cell phone number in case we get separated." Three-quarters of the Rowdies (dare I say all the active members) have already provided their cell phone number to our list. In less than a minute you can have a 2-page list (one, if you know how to do two-sided printing) with name, address, home phone, cell phone, and email. 93% have furnished an email address.

The steps to do this are easy provided you have a computer and printer. Doesn't everyone? I can think of two members that don't. That is why we provide a printed copy once a year with the printed version of A-Antics. Here's how to do it on your computer:

1. Go to the web site at www.mgcars.org.uk/ michiganrowdies/

2. Click on "Members Only" in the left hand column.

3. Enter your Last Name, first letter capitalized, in the box provided.

- 4. Enter your password. Email the Webmaster, Larry Pittman, at larrypit@chartermi.net if you do not recall your password. (Everyone initially was assigned a complex password. Since our system does not allow members to change their password themselves I highly recommend you ask Larry to change your password to something easy for you to remember.)
- 5. Click on Submit.

6. Click on "Membership Listing" on the line that says To View or Download: Membership Listing.

7. A neat 2-page listing appears, ready to print. Turn on your printer.

8. Print as many copies as you wish using your computer's browser menu. On mine I select "File" and then "Print" from the menu at the top of screen. Personally, I usually print three copies - one for the house, one for the garage, and one for the car.

Reading John Alexander's write-up in A-Antics got me thinking. It wasn't all that long ago or was it - when a trip to the salvage yard could supply your needed part. The rows of cars would be spread before you. "Yah, you'll find the MGs along the fence on the left side." I've got memories of pulling parts and the occasional surprises that came with the task. The snakes were harmless but they could still get your immediate attention. Wasps and hornets loved living in these old bones and they were substantially more territorial and mean. Most of the yards around Clarkston and Drayton Plains where I lived at the time catered to American iron. However, there was one on Dixie Highway between Pontiac and Flint that had a rather large selection of foreign cars. It was easy to get side tracked because it was always enjoyable from an engineering side to see what was under their sheet metal.

There usually wasn't a lot left on the MGA bare bones chassis by the time I went on my treasure hunts. Still, I never left empty-handed and have to say I miss it. It reflects back to a simpler time. And when you did find a treasure it was the correct part and fit like it should. Along that same stretch of highway was a business called the Whoopee Bowl. A guy could spend the day wondering down isle after isle of car related parts. If it went on a Pontiac or Buick, they had it. It was chucked full of over-stock items, items that had minor flaws, old resale items, and brand new items that somehow found a way out of the nearby factories. Wonderful places like that have pretty much gone away due to community clean up crackdowns, insurance liability, and tighter plant security. I miss those simple times. Dave Quinn (Ed. Note: I sure do too. I used to dig up PS pumps for my 1967 Dodge Coronet 383 in junk yards until the late 1980's. They were specific for that year car and engine size & unobtainable elsewhere. I still can't get used to calling those sources 'Salvage Yards' and I know Jim Croce wouldn't have written about mean 'salvage yard' dogs either.)

I wanted to provide a very brief update on our status for GT-40. This is just an organization update in that all the chairpersons are now in place. There have not been any other changes to the plan. The next major event remains the visit to the Frankenmuth site in May by Carol Shamonsky (NAMGAR vice chair).

Treasurer's Report

Jeff Zorn is in FL and was unable to be present. Expenses and income for 2011 were reviewed and details are available on request. The Rowdies expenses were \$2631.74 and income was \$2971.24 for a net gain of \$339.10. A large amount of our expense is in the A-Antics newsletter and in the Christmas Party, which is subsidized about 50% by the club. The rental of the Bone Island Grill next year will go up \$100. After discussion it was voted to increase the member cost of the Christmas party to \$15/person to cover the additional expense.

A question was raised about using PayPal to pay yearly dues. Jeff Zorn was later contacted and stated that PayPal or something similar is not a viable option at this time due to added fees charged. Jeff also requested that if anyone has an expense to be reimbursed by the club to please submit it as a separate item and do not just subtract it from your dues payment.

A-Antics Editor's Report

Ken Nelson spoke briefly and thanked all the members who had submitted articles or

pictures over the past year. The newsletter is vital to keeping our members involved in the club activities, and Ken requested that as many members as possible take part in writing or submitting anything that is of interest to the members or pertaining to MG's (esp MGA's of course).

It is especially important for someone to write up a brief report of our events to publish, along with pictures of people (first) and cars (second). If someone volunteers at a meet to do a write-up and lets Ken know it makes his job a bit easier.

Bruce Nichols stated we have had several new members join recently (see Chairman's Report above) and they were warmly welcomed into the club.

Ken and Kathy Nelson mentioned that Phil & Jan Wiltshire's Stratford Meet is still scheduled and is a wonderful chance to drive your MGA thru beautiful country with a convoy of MG's and enjoy food and drink and a play for the weekend. Regalia Discussion

<u>Regalia Accessibility – Is this an issue?</u>

Brian Beery is limited to a cell phone and has no Internet, no email, and no way to share ideas online with vendors.

Discussion ensued about having someone with

internet access assist Brian. John McMullan kindly volunteered to take on this position with Brian. Philip Wiltshire had originally been helping Brian, but is now working and staying in South Carolina/Georgia all year, so is unable to continue. Steve Finch has Philips supplies and will transfer then over to Brian and John.

It was noted that we are out of Grill Badges and question was raised about ordering more. We have paid a one time \$220 pattern fee already, so any more will cost about \$22 to the club. Several members expressed interest in buying one if a new batch is ordered.

Catalog ordering with 3-4 week turn around. Would need to carry a certain amount of inventory still to have some examples on display at a meet. Discussion ensued about "impulse buying" when the item is ready for immediate purchase, vs how many people would be willing to pay at a meet and wait for a mail order to arrive at their home in 3-4 weeks?

The S2000 Club uses "Corporate Casuals", Concord MA. In business since 1999, 30 employees. 866-369-5935. Catalog ordering, no minimum and 3-4 day shipping. Club members order direct with a small discount... However, the club receives no profit.... But the club does no work and carries no inventory.

A consensus was reached that we do wish to make a reasonable profit from sales for the club. Decision was made to see what items we have left and review Philip's record of sales to see which items sold the best and to help decide on items and vendor later. Consideration has to also be given to how much effort and expense is involved if club has extensive inventory to bring to individual meets.

<u>Regalia Pricing – What's best?</u>

- Current pricing in March 2010 set at just above cost. Idea was to promote club, not make a big profit.
- What should the margin be in future? Near cost? 10% 20% 30%? This tied in with which vendor we may wish to use.
 Decision was made to mark items up by 20% if club sells directly. Most commercial establishments mark up 30%, so this would be a benefit to members as well as provide some income to the club.

Pop-Up Tent – Good idea or not?

The Pros and Cons of obtaining a club tent were discussed as follows:

- 1. Tent Objectives
 - A focal point which makes club's presence known
 - A shady gathering spot for members
 - A regalia sales point (earlier survey showed 27 members willing to work table)
 - A place for new member promo & applications
 - A focal point at GT40 lot
- 2. Key to buying Tent
 - Someone must commit to haul to MI's four key events or arrange for backup.
 - Events: Mad Dogs, Twist Meet, Rowdies Birthday Party, and Battle of Brits.
 - Must store, haul, setup, and take down
 - Must forego driving MG or take on luggage rack
 - Must be or co-ordinate with regalia chairman
- 3. Tent Cost
 - Costs run from \$90 (Harbor Freight) to \$500 for a quality light weight one
 - A free used tent available in May. No graphics. Condition unknown.
- 4. Things to consider in purchase of Tent
 ➤ Hauling, light weight with short poles
 - \succ Recognition, 8 graphics
 - > Bag for hauling, often separate cost
 - > Windy day, ability to stake down
- Size, 10x10 is norm but 8x8 may be sufficient A consensus seemed to be that having the tent be light weight and compact (and thus more expensive) would be very important. Commitment and ability to haul this to meets is critical as well. Gordie Bird will check with Jeff Zorn about his

offer of a used tent and we may try this out

initially. Bruce Nichols said proper storage and drying after use is crucial to keeping usable for at least 3 years. We may run a poll in A-Antics for more member input before considering a future purchase. Club name and graphics on tent also felt important.

Christmas Party Cost

Room rental to go up \$100 to \$350 for the day. Total club dues last year were only slightly over \$1k. Can we still afford this?

2011 Expense Breakdown: Meals \$566 Room \$250 \$ 20 Misc out-of-pocket LBC \$ 25 club portion of drawing Total \$861 \$343 door collections Less Club cost \$518 Room rental cost up another \$100 next year.

After discussion it was voted to continue the party at the Bone Island Grill as before but increase the member cost to \$15 per person.

New Business

Dick Grucz mentioned that he could probably arrange for Michigan Brewing Co. to do a limited run of several beers with a customized GT-40 label printed just for our GT in 2015. There was loud and prolonged vocal support for this.

Larry Pittman gave an update on his plans for GT-40 so far. He has appointed several volunteers to head up various committees for planning for the GT. See list and comments on page 9. Everyone who has an interest in helping with plans is encouraged to talk to Larry. As time gets closer we will hopefully be able to call on almost all the Rowdies attending to assist and make GT-40 truly a Rowdie Club affair.

Carol Shamonsky from NAMGAR will be coming up sometime in May to visit Frankenmuth and the Bavarian Inn with us to finalize a contract.

Larry is organizing a meet at his house May 5th for "Drive your MG Day" and will discuss further planning with committee members then also. We're all getting fired up to produce a "blow-out" meet for GT-40, but much work is yet to be done.

Ken: I see you're looking at a leaky rear axle...the attached article appeared in the HoosierA's newsletter in. 1985, written by Bob Kaskey (~who sadly passed away a few years ago), offering another way to solve the problem of leaking seals. See what you think... **Bill Gallibugb** Hoosier A's



The left real seal on my A has been leaking on and off since the car was bought in 1970. I've already replaced the seal on it once out the darn thing started leaking soon after and until recently I'd adopted the "ignore it and it may go away" attitude. After cleaning layers of gunk off the spokes last summer for the fifth time, I called a friend, "Wedge" Rafferty, who teaches the auto shop at Rensselaer Central High School. Wedge has been my "main man" in all the restoration work on my A and he solved my problem with a little research.

As a little background, I should mention that Wedge worked on A's (and many other foreign car types) in South Bend when he was with an M.G. dealer and our cars were new. He's a founder of that city's A.S.C.A. and even raced A's on the circuit. (His last racing A was named Marietta after his wife).

Anyway, wedge remembered that one of his tricks at that time was to install a wheel seal with a slightly smaller inside diameter and that seemed to do the trick. The specs are as follows:

Old Seal - (The one you'll get at NAPA if you just tell them you. want a rear seal for an MGA) is part #66555. It's the same seal for 1957 models through the youngest MGB. The sizes are 70mm O.D., 49.2mm I.D. and 9.5mm wide. DO NOT BUY THIS SEAL.

New Seal - is NAPA replacement part #47609. The O.D. is still Toman O.D. and 9.5 mm wide, but the I.D. is only 49mm. This translatas to about 20 thousandths smaller in diameter and should do the trick. The cost is about \$6.00 for this size seal.

Is your side curtain rubber brittle and cracked? Dave Quinn found a solution.

"I bought older unused side curtains from Art Lewis in GR. I believe there were three different OEM side curtains plus several after-market brands. These are aftermarket. According to Todd Clarke these were made by Knolls Tool and are considered a little better than the other prominent supplier at the time, AMCO. AMCO are nearly identical except they have a mitered aluminum corner in the front top edge. The rubber that was in these curtains was terrible - brittle from aging even without use. The tops and sides were way too wide, so I bought Todd Clarke's side curtain rubber kit for under \$50. The rubber only required trimming where the joints come together. More importantly it was very soft and installed easily. The joints are a little tricky but the Loctite glue that comes with it worked great (of course time will be the real test). The rubber has a natural curve to it. You install so it tips inward to deflect water." Dave Quinn

Bruce & Willy Mann's MGA Rebuild-Part 3

Well, it has been a while since writing about the status of the MGA restoration. Today is March 1 2012; it has been almost 3 years since we started this project. As you may remember it was a leaky master cylinder causing all the problems. Well we pulled it out and bought a new one, in June 2009. What we found underneath was most of the paint removed from the old non synthetic hydraulic oil. It dripped through the hole over the brake and clutch petals

onto the floor and had a negative impact on that area as well.

We bought a new master cylinder almost 3 years ago and it is now on the car, bolted in with new hydraulic lines but not yet activated.

What seemed like a simple fix, replace the master cylinder, and has turned into quite a project.

I did this back in 1976 but not to this extent, and being much younger it seemed much simpler. Took most things off and told the painter/fabricator make it look good. I was busy with a job and the car exterior had minor rust but was in need of a good paint job. So \$700.00 later I was putting most things back on.

Well, that was then and this is now, a complete restoration. Sounded simple but as most of you know very difficult and time consuming. It is a good thing I am retired and have a partner who enjoys working on the car with me

The car is now nestled into the garage at home, and is in re-assembly. We have had most of the family, and now including my granddaughter Allison (Al) during Christmas break, at different times involved in putting her back together, but not without some issues. Well, we are working everyday, making good progress, but not without issues. Our problems have been with fit up. The sills and rocker thickness, due to excessive mig welding, has caused many issues with

door closure. I learned a little too late that the sill area with 4 pieces of steel needed to be .125-.135 thousanths. We had upwards of .300 in the corners and . 275 on the horizontal area between the "A" and "B" pillars.

We had to grind the sills down to a tolerance of about .140 to .150, and repaint the area. We went from SF to Clarke Spares weather stripping and

that alone wouldn't do it either. The interior side panels were recovered in leather and with the material thickness of those being in excess of .250 thousands, it caused more stack up issues. We had to modify those as well. We had to finally make a tough decision, one that I did not want to make, but cut the rubber off the Clarke Spares weather stripping. We'll have to live with that issue. So we did, and put on the felt stripping and the door panel, and the door finally closed. I guess I will not be able to drive in the rain, but who thought I would anyway?

Oh, by the way, we got the car back in December, and it had to go back to the body shop, after all the time away, to have the "B" pillar modified to accept the shut face. That was another big issue. Amazing how you forget those things.

We are about 90% complete with the assembly of the car. Got to make that GT coming up! We have now attended 3 annual Rowdy meetings, and numerous events, and have met a lot of nice and talented people.

I would like to thank all of you for helping me, whether on the phone, pictures sent on the internet, in the garage or just in conversations we have had at numerous events. It is all appreciated. I will need some help with getting it going, and hope to count on some of you experts to assist in the firing of the engine......Until then, Thanks again,
